The next day, Anne and Mark sign the lease and pay a **security deposit**. The security deposit will help to pay for the cost of any necessary repairs. The manager asks them when they plan to move in. They answer "in a few days' time."

To help with the housework and whatnot.


It can cook fine cuisine


