*Television transmission*

In 1927 John Logie Baird transmitted television <sup>(1)</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (**direct**) from London to Glasgow and a few months <sup>(2)</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (**late**) from London to New York. In the same year he gave demonstrations of colour <sup>(3)</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (**transmit**), of stereoscopic or three dimensional television and of a new invention which he called noctovision, by which pictures were transmitted in the dark on infra red rays.

The B.B.C. still <sup>(4)</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (**refuse**) to work with him, and the government had to order it to start transmissions. The first outside television <sup>(5)</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (**broadcast**) was of Derby in 1931.

Meanwhile scientists <sup>(6)</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (**keep**) themselves busy in other countries, including the United States.
